

2023 NGAWV State Conference Recap

The National Guard Association of West Virginia and the Enlisted Association of West Virginia held the annual State Conference April 28-29, 2023, at Camp Dawson. This year's conference featured many new updates to the format to include live entertainment, the inclusion of professional development sessions and opportunities for our corporate sponsors to present during the business session.

Kicking off the weekend on Friday was the Enlisted and Officer professional development sessions, where senior leaders both past and present, offered advice about service in the National Guard, being engaged with legislative issues and overall leadership lessons. MG Bill Crane, the Adjutant General, led the officer professional development alongside Brig. Gen. (Ret.) Paige Hunter, BG Michaelle Munger, and Brig. Gen. Mike Cadle while CSM Dusty Jones, CSM Chad Moneypenny and CMSqt Brandon Ives led the enlisted session.

During the business session on Saturday morning, we had the privilege of receiving a report from the West Virginia Retired Military Council, conducted the normal business of the association to include reports on financials, voting in new members and passing resolutions for inclusion at the national level. The NGAWV voted in favor of submitting two resolutions this year related to modernization of C-130 and C-17 aircraft. These resolutions are designed to address critical shortfalls in modernization outfitting for the C-130J on tactical data link capability and extended fuel tacks for the C-17 fleet in the Air National Guard. Both resolutions passed and were submitted to NGAUS for consideration in the 2025 Resolutions process.

The NGAWV also recognized the outstanding Army and Air Officers of the Year, which included LTC Sam Oliver of the 2/19th Special Forces Battalion and Capt. Aaron Hansrote of the 167th Airlift Wing. Lt. Sammi Brown was awarded the Scarboro-Sencindiver Award for her contributions to the NGAWV over the past year. Additionally, LTC Bob Luther was recognized for running the fastest time during the Broadwater 5K and the Joint Forces Headquarters unit was recognized for having the highest attendance at the conference for 2023.

The Nevada National Guard Association has finalized the planned social events and activities at the 145th General Conference & Exhibition in Reno, Nevada, Aug. 18-21.

Activities begin Aug. 18 with the NGAUS Golf Tournament at the Lakeridge Golf Course. The Robert Trent Jones-designed course offers views of Reno and the surrounding mountains. The signature hole is No. 15, a world-famous par 3 overlooking Lake Stanley with an island green.

Two other events on Aug. 18 will take participants into the mountains. One is the NGAUS Vibrations Motorcycle Ride. Riders will start and end in Reno, but can choose between two different scenic routes.

The first route is a leisurely ride to and around Lake Tahoe, North America's largest alpine lake, before stopping at Carson City, Nevada's capital. The second is more challenging, with twisting roads, Lake Tahoe and a visit to the historic mining town of Virginia City. You can bring your own bike or rent one.

There is also a scheduled hike up Mount Rose on Aug. 18, which rises to become the highest and most topographically prominent peak of the greater Sierra Nevada range in the state.

The traditional conference mixers are the evening of Aug. 18. Company-grade officers and warrant officers will gather at Greater Nevada Field in Reno for dinner, drinks, music and a minor-league baseball game.

Meanwhile, field-grade officers will head to the National Automobile Museum, which features more than 225 rare, one-of-a-kind, antique and collector cars. Food and drink will be served on the museum's south patio.

Traditionally the conference's last event, the States Dinner will be held downtown Aug. 19 at the Reno Events Center. Western Wear is the recommended attire. Entertainment will follow.

The Spouses Luncheon is downtown at the Reno Ballroom Aug. 20. Expect a 1920s Speakeasy theme with lunch and a theatrical production featuring a murder mystery. There will also be gifts for all participants and prizes for a lucky few.

The Governor's Farewell will conclude the conference Aug. 21 at the Reno Events Center. The event will feature food, drinks and a concert by a name performer.

CAPITOL SUMMIT

The dates for the next Capitol Summit have been set for 17-19 September. This professional-development program brings Guardsmen from each state and territory to the nation's capital for a close look at how the government works and the role NGAUS plays in the legislative process. The NGAWV Executive Committee selects a CGO from the Army or Air that have been nominated by their commands.

GRAY AREA RETIREES

Senate legislation introduced last week would enable traditional National Guardsmen and Reservists eligible for early retirement to purchase low-cost military medical coverage upon receiving retirement pay instead of waiting until they reach age 60. <u>FULL STORY</u>

WVNG LEGISLATIVE PRIORITES

For the FY2024 NDAA, the Adjutant General submitted the following projects for potential inclusion in the NDAA. Many of these projects are related to military construction across the Army and Air National Guard. The top priorities were as follows:

- A covered facility at Camp Dawson that would enable Soldiers to conduct the Army ACFT.
- Funding for the Ridge Runner Irregular Warfare Center to conduct IW-focused validation training for deploying units.
- Funding to authorize demolition and renovation of numerous buildings at the 130th Airlift Wing to move toward progress on a new Squadron Operations Building.
- Funding to complete a new small arms range at the 167th Airlift Wing.
- Planning and design funding for armories throughout the state.

Other legislative priorities that are being worked with West Virginia's Congressional Delegation include upgrades to the C-130J and C-17 as well as NGAUS priorities such as Zero Cost Tricare and the creation of a Space National Guard.
